

What would you like for Christmas? Has anyone said that to you? Yes, me too. However I think that most of our little ones who come to Sunbeams on Monday mornings can't answer that yet. Not for long though. Very soon children seem to know exactly what they want. Our Christmas stocking with an apple and an orange and some nuts and a pair of gloves seems a long time ago - and of course it is. Times certainly have changed.

For now, many of our Sunbeams will be happy with a box or wrapping paper and not so notinterested in what's inside the box. Their eagerness and shining eyes when they see the lights twinkling on the trees are a sight to treasure.

We keep busy on Monday mornings with around 40-45 children and, of course, almost as many adults.

Recently we have had a Bun Sale to raise money for Children in Need and, with a topup from our funds, were able to send off £140 to this very worthy cause.

Deborah has had one of her Knitting Sales in aid of Drumbeat. Many people went home very happy with their purchases. We are grateful to Barbara Rumfitt for being our "Shop Girl" for the morning. Deborah took £140 on the day and was happy with that.

We increased our subs at the beginning of September so that we could make a regular contribution to church funds. We have also supported Action for Children and we now sponsor Messy Church. A few months ago I was asked if the church could put the Sunbeams helpers forward in a competition set by Methodist Insurance, to acknowledge the part that volunteers play in the life of the Methodist Church and its

community. The UK is divided up into 11 regions and there will be a winner in each region who will win £1,000 for their church.

There will then be an overall winner from the the 11 regional winners, who will win  $\pounds$ 3,000 (in total) for their church. The regional winners will be announced by the end of January 2020 and there will be a Special Awards Evening in October when the overall winner is revealed.

Apparently they have had lots of inspiring entries and so I am not sure whether we hear any more from Methodist Insurance!

However, I would like to tell you that all our Sunbeams helpers are even better than Santa's little helpers and without them, we would not be able to continue. SoI can only say a big thank you to each and every one of them and hope we can keep going a little longer.
